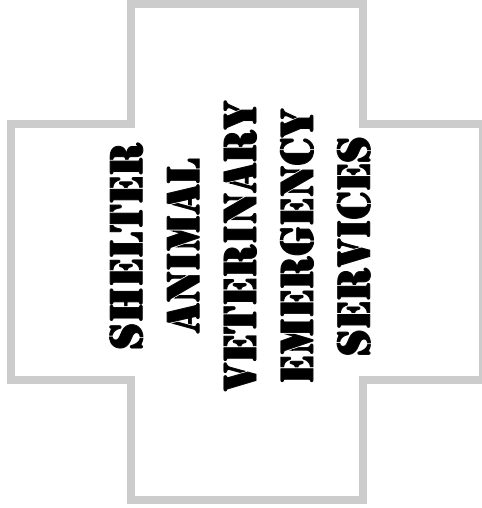

It is a special medical fund to supplement the operating budget at the Young-Williams Animal Center for:

- ☒ Treating stray animals who have suffered physical trauma
- ☒ Adoptable animals with non-contagious illnesses
- ☒ Foster care for animals who need a little healing time in a special place before they can be adopted into a home

The Animal Center can't guarantee that any animal in their care will find a forever home. However, this fund will help ensure that each animal receives the very best care available



while at the Animal Center. It will also increase the chances of adoption for some pets.

WHY HAVE A SPECIAL FUND LIKE SAVES?

Each year, the Animal Center shelters thousands of homeless and unwanted animals. Many of those animals arrive at the Animal Center with injuries suffered while they were away from their families. They may have been hit by a car, been bitten or scratched by another animal, harmed by a person, or be undernourished and weak from their time on the streets.

Some of these animals in distress will be reclaimed by their families, but most will not. A little medicine, special care, and time is often all it takes to transform an injured, scared animal into the perfect pet.

That's where **SAVES** comes in.
